Rationale	We believe these uniforms will make a big difference to our students and their whanau. The students' current situation is as follows:

	<p>J.M & D.M (siblings) – Come from a single parent family where funds are tight. They are both exceptional students who do very well academically but both are wearing uniforms that are too small and worn out e.g. shoes have tape on them. A new uniform would mean that both can participate in inter school activities like debating (which they both love) confidently – looking like their team mates.</p> <p>T.G – Has just had a growth spurt and his current uniform (bought last year) no longer fits. T.G’s family are a great part of our school’s community and are always trying to help others. They’ve got two other children starting intermediate this year and unfortunately can’t afford a new uniform for T.G by the start of term. It would be great to be able to help them with this unexpected cost and reduce their start of year stress!</p> <p>F.N – Comes from a big family and currently wears her older sister’s hand-me-down uniform. The uniform has seen better days and is a little on the baggy side for her. She often feels embarrassed about her clothes and this results in her being reluctant to participate in assemblies. As her parents are supporting 5 other kids on a fairly low income – a brand new uniform is not a possibility for them at this time.</p> <p>D.J – This young man has just become a prefect and while his family have been able to purchase the basic uniform piece by piece, they are not able to afford the school blazer on top of everything else. D.J represents our school at many events and it would make him feel very special if he could wear a blazer to these events.</p> <p>[Gives context on why each student needs funding/explains their current situation – the story behind the application]</p>
Activities	<p>Ongoing – all students will feel better prepared for class and will have good, warm, well-fitting uniforms. They will be able to attend and participate in school events without worrying about how their uniform looks.</p>
Beneficiaries	<p>All 5 students and their families, there will be less stress for all at the start of the year. The school will also benefit from having these lovely students feel confident while representing us!</p>

Expected Outcomes	<p>More participation in class. More confidence when representing school. Improved learning ability due to being warm and comfortable. Improved experiences during the school day.</p> <p>All students will be able to attend in full uniform without standing out from the other students and not feeling different.</p>
